The Tudor Trust is an independent grant-making trust which supports charities and community groups working across the UK. We do not focus our funding on specific themes or programmes but instead want to support a wide range of people and organisations working to achieve lasting change in their communities. Tudor aims to support work which addresses the social, emotional and financial needs of people at the margins of society, and is interested in how organisations tackle these needs, and their root causes.

Tudor is most interested in helping smaller, under-resourced organisations which offer direct services and which involve the people they work with in their planning. We do not have fixed funding priorities but are looking for a number of key characteristics in the organisations we fund. These include:

- Organisations which are embedded in and have developed out of their community – whether the local area or a ‘community of interest’
- Organisations providing direct services to marginalised people
- A focus on building stronger communities by overcoming isolation and fragmentation and encouraging inclusion, connection and integration
- High levels of user involvement, and an emphasis on self-help where this is appropriate
- Work which addresses complex and multi-stranded, often difficult, problems in unusual or imaginative ways
- Organisations which are thoughtful in their use of resources and which foster community resilience in the face of environmental, economic or social change
- Organisations and people who know what difference they want to make and have the energy and vision to make it happen

We are most likely to fund groups with an annual turnover of less than £1 million.

This grants list details the grants made by the Tudor Trust from April 2009 to March 2010.

## Tudor's grant making in 2009-2010

Over the year Tudor funded work which addressed our overarching aim of tackling the social, emotional and financial needs of people on the margins of society in many different ways. Tudor does not have set funding priorities: we support the groups we fund in deciding what to do and how to do it and we see our role as offering some of the resources they need to achieve their aims. This means that our grants support a huge variety of organisations and work – from an organisation working with pregnant women and new mothers in a London prison to a community food project in Glasgow; from an organisation supporting young care leavers in Northern Ireland to a self-help group for survivors of sexual abuse in Nottingham.

Although we make grants to organisations our ultimate beneficiaries are of course the thousands of individuals that these groups work with, rather than the groups themselves. While working with applicants and grant holders we are constantly aware they are acting as advocates for the people they support. It is important that it is these people whose voices are heard during our decision-making process.

## ★The CLT Fund

The Community Land Trust (CLT) Fund was launched in September 2008 by the Tudor Trust, the Esmée Fairbairn Foundation and Venturesome. During 2009–2010 further contributions were made towards aspects of the Fund by CAF, the Nationwide Foundation and an individual investor.

The CLT Fund is intended to help to establish new Community Land Trusts and to support the development of affordable housing. Through a Community Land Trust, local people acquire co-operative ownership of land with the intention of creating affordable housing which will benefit the local area and its inhabitants in perpetuity. Tudor is acting as the administrator for the feasibility and technical assistance components of the CLT Fund.
